

Measuring and Sizing Guide



Neck: Measure around the base of the neck – number of inches equals the neck size

Chest: Measure under the arms and across the shoulder blades

Sleeves: Measure from the center back at the neck base along the shoulder and down arm to wrist with elbow slightly bent

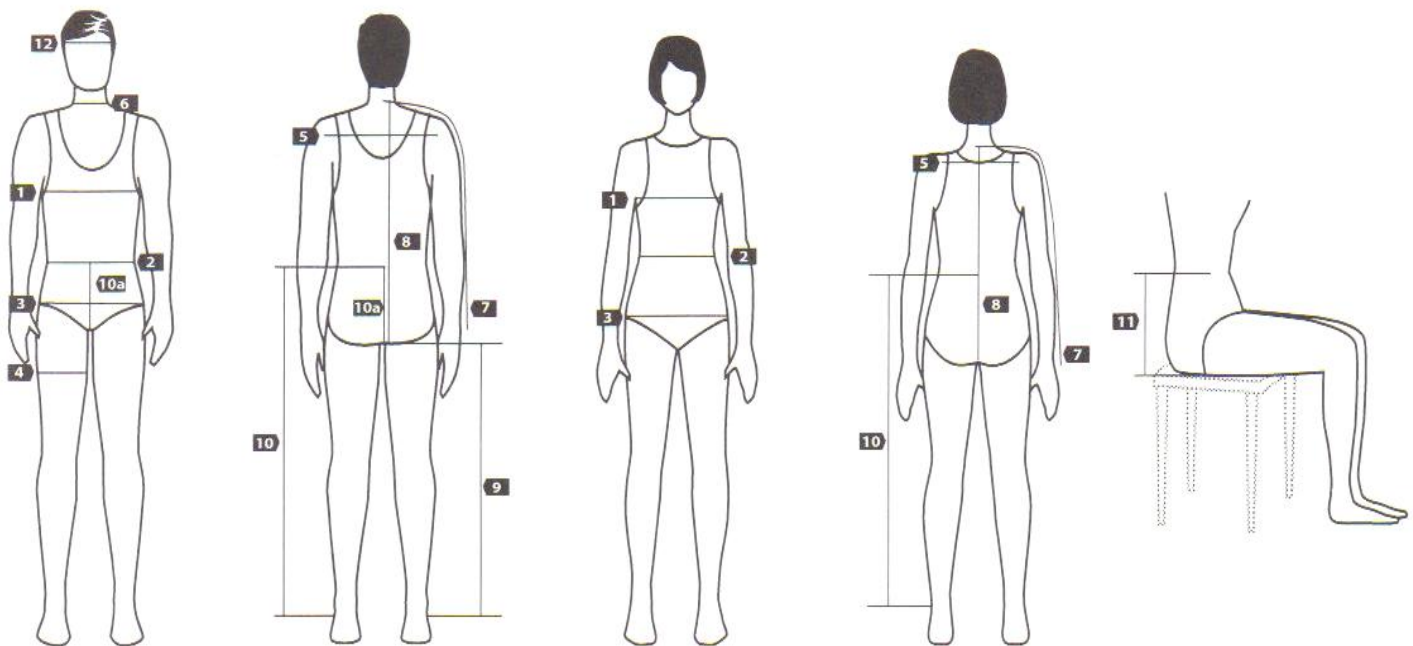
Waist: Stand evenly balanced on both feet. Measure around the smallest part of the natural waistband, just above the hip bones

Seat: Measure around the fullest part of the seat

Inseam: Measure along the inner seam of the crotch seam to the desired length at the cuff

Outseam: Stand straight. Measure from the top of the waistband to the desired length at the cuff

Head: Measure around the fullest part of the head



- 1. Chest/Bust** —with arms down and relaxed, measure around the fullest part of the chest. Keep tape up under the arms, across the shoulder blades.
- 2. Waist** — measure around waist, where you normally wear your pants. Measure over shirt, but not over slacks or belt. You should easily be able to slip two fingers under the tape.
- 3. Hip** — measure at the fullest part of the hips. Make sure tape is comfortable not too tight.
- 4. Thigh** — measure around thigh at approximately 1" below crotch.
- 5. Shoulder** — measure across the shoulder blade from joint to joint (width of back).
- 6. Neck** — measure around the base of the neck.
- 7. Sleeve Length** — measure from nape of neck over the shoulder to the wrist bone, to desired length.
- 8. Coat Length** —measure from the nape of the neck to below the seat area (approximately 1" below buttocks).
- 9. Inseam** — measure from crotch along inside leg to desired length. Take this measurement with shoes on. If you have a similar pair of well-fitting pants, lay flat smoothing out front and back creases, measure along inside seam, from crotch to bottom of hem.
- 10. Outseam** — measure from bottom of waistband along seam line to desired length. Take this measurement with shoes on.
- 10a. Male Rise** — difference between the outseam and the inseam.
- 11. Female Rise** — should be taken with person setting on chair and measured from bottom of waistband to seat on chair. This determines is the rise.
- 12. Cap Measurement** — measure 3/4" above ear where your hat will be worn. Pull the tape tight to measure within 1/8".

Tips on Lengths

Short = S, SH, SHT
A short is generally 1" shorter.

Regular = R, REG

Long = L, LNG
A long is generally 1" longer.

Fit is an essential ingredient in footwear. Properly fit shoes and boots will be comfortable to wear right out of the box; they don't need to be "broken in." There are few simple guidelines that if followed can make the process easy:

Tap your heel back in the heel cup and lace the boot. The boot should feel snug across the ball, around the instep, and in the heel. The arch should be comfortably supported and the toes should be free to wiggle and curl.

The toes should not jam into the front of the boot. Check this by lightly tapping the toe of the boot into the floor. If the boot fits correctly, the toes should gently touch the end of the boot.

Footwear is made in an array of widths in order to provide our customers with the best fit possible. See chart below for width descriptions:

B = Narrow width	C = One width wider than B	D = Average or medium width
E = the narrower of the "Wide" widths	EEE = our widest width	M = Equal to a "D" or medium
W = Equal to an "E" or wide width	EW = Equal to an "EEE" or extra wide	

Whenever possible have your foot measured with a Brannock device by a shoe care professional. Using a Brannock device is the most accurate method to determine your shoe size and width.

Shoe Care

Here is everything you need to know to ensure your boots or shoes are in great shape now and in the future

Store shoes and boots with a shoe tree. This will help the shoe retain its shape while drying it properly. Never store or dry shoes near direct heat.

To extend the life of your footwear it is recommended to alternate your shoes daily. Pairs alternated everyday and stored overnight with shoetrees will typically last more than twice as long as a single pair of shoes worn everyday.

For cleaning Leather

Remove excess dirt with a soft brush.

For the most effective shine remove the laces before you start polishing.

If using a polish or cream be sure to apply evenly with a brush or soft cloth. Once polish has dried buff to a shine using a natural bristle brush.

Instant shine liquids are also available. Remove excess dirt then evenly apply liquid to leather portion of your shoe or boot. These formulations dry to a shine without buffing.

For cleaning leather or rough side out leather

Leathers unique properties allow for more liberal cleaning techniques than other rough out boots.

Allow dirt to dry before cleaning. Brush dried dirt from boot with a medium bristled brush.

After removing loose dry dirt, a mixture of warm water and mild dish soap can be applied with a medium bristle brush. Rinse with clear water and repeat if necessary.

Allow to dry naturally.

Rebrush the entire boot with a clean medium bristle brush.
